### Step 7

# "Humbly asked Him to remove our shortcomings."

Since this Step so specifically concerns itself with humility, we should pause here to consider what humility is and what the practice of it can mean to us.

Indeed, the attainment of greater humility is the foundation principle of each of A.A.'s Twelve Steps. For without some degree of humility, no alcoholic can stay sober at all. Nearly all A.A.'s have found, too, that unless they develop much more of this precious quality than may be required just for sobriety, they still haven't much chance of becoming truly happy. Without it, they cannot live to much useful purpose, or, in adversity, be able to summon the faith that can meet any emergency.

### **The 7th Tradition**

"Every A.A. group ought to be fully self-supporting, declining outside contributions."

Self-supporting alcoholics? Who ever heard of such a thing? Yet we find that's what we have to be. This principle is telling evidence of the profound change that A.A. has wrought in all of us. Everybody knows that active alcoholics scream that they have no troubles money can't cure. Always, we've had our hands out. Time out of mind we've been dependent upon somebody, usually money-wise. When a society composed entirely of alcoholics says it's going to pay its bills, that's really news.

Probably no A.A. Tradition had the labor pains this one did. In early times, we were all broke. When you add to this the habitual supposition that people ought to give money to alcoholics trying to stay sober, it can be understood why we thought we deserved a pile of folding money. What great things A.A. would be able to do with it? But oddly enough, people who had money thought otherwise. They figured that it was high time we now - sober paid our own way. So our Fellowship stayed poor because it had to.

## Daily Reflections excerpt on the 7th Step

In every case, pain had been the price of admission into a new life. But this admission price has

purchased more than we expected. It brought a measure of humility, which we soon discovered to be a healer of pain.

12 & 12, p. 75

It was painful to give up trying to control my life, even though success eluded me, and when life got too rough, I drank to escape. Accepting life on life's terms will be mastered through the humility I experience when I turn my will and my life over to the care of God, as I understand Him. With my life in God's care, fear, uncertainty, and anger are no longer my response to the portions of life that I would rather not have happen to me. The pain of living through these times will be healed by the knowledge that I have received the spiritual strength to survive.

### **Chapter V. The alcoholic in the Oxford Group**

(continued from June Scoop)

It was Anne who persuaded Dr. Bob to go to Oxford Group meetings in the first place, but he later found himself attracted to members of the group "because of their seeming poise, health, and happiness.

"These people spoke with great freedom from embarrassment, which I could never do," he said. "They seemed very much at ease." Above all, Dr. Bob was impressed because "they seemed to be happy. I was self-conscious and ill at ease most of the time, my health was at the breaking point, and I was thoroughly miserable."

Dr. Bob realized that these newfound friends "had something I did not have." He thought he might profit from an association with them. If he did not, it wouldn't do him any harm.

Probably because of his earlier church experiences, his enthusiasm cooled somewhat when he found that their program had a spiritual aspect. However, it was reassuring to know that they did not meet in a church, but at the Mayflower Hotel and in private homes.

Dr. Bob and Anne were regular attenders at the West Hill group, which met on Thursday night. He and a few others might have been alcoholics, but he would not admit this in the beginning, when "I at no time sensed that it might be an answer to my liquor problem."

For the next two and a half years, Bob attended Oxford Group meeting regularly and gave much time and study to its

philosophy. It might be said, in fact, that he then embarked on a spiritual search destined to last for the rest of his life.

"I read everything I could find, and talked to everyone who I thought knew anything about it," Dr. Bob said. He read the Scriptures, studied the lives of the saints, and did what he could to soak up the spiritual and religious philosophies of the ages. Still, he got drunk.

Another of the regular attenders of the West Hill meeting was Henrietta Seiberling, daughter-in-law of Frank A. Seiberling, founder and first president of Goodyear Tire and Rubber Company. A graduate of Vassar College, Henrietta was at the time a young housewife with three teenage children who were also members of the Oxford Group.

As she recalled it (in 1978, the year before her death), a friend named Delphine Weber asked her one night in March or April 1935, "What are we going to do about Bob Smith?"

"What's wrong with him?" Henrietta asked.

He is a terrible drinker,"
Delphine replied, noting that he
was having problems at the
hospital and was practically
bankrupt because of his drinking.

"I immediately felt guided that we should have a meeting for Bob Smith, before Bill (Wilson) ever came to Akron," said Henrietta. She went to fellow Oxford Groupers T. Henry and Clarace Williams and asked whether it would be possible to use their home as a meeting place. They readily agreed. (Continued in August edition of the Scoop.)
