Tradition 7 "Every A.A. group ought to be fully selfsupporting, declining outside contributions."

"The A.A. groups themselves ought to be fully supported by the voluntary contributions of their own members. We think that each group should soon achieve this ideal; that any public solicitation of funds using the name of Alcoholics Anonymous is highly dangerous, whether by groups, clubs, hospitals, or other outside agencies; that acceptance of large gifts from any source, or of contributions carrying any obligation whatever, is unwise. Then, too, we view with much concern those A.A. treasuries which continue, beyond prudent reserves, to accumulate funds for no stated A.A. purpose. Experience has often warned us that nothing can so surely destroy our spiritual heritage as futile disputes over property, money, and authority."

Traditions Checklist: The 7th

These questions were originally published in the AA Grapevine in conjunction with a series on the Twelve Traditions that began in November 1969 and ran through September 1971. While they were originally intended primarily for individual use, many AA groups have since used them as a basis for wider discussion.

Tradition 7

- Honestly now, do I do all I can to help A.A. (my group, my central office, my GSO) remain selfsupporting? Could I put a little more into the basket on behalf of the new guy who can't afford it yet? How generous was I when tanked in a barroom?
- 2. Should the Grapevine sell advertising space to book publishers and drug companies, so it could make a big profit and become a bigger magazine, in full color, at a cheaper price per copy?

- **3.** If GSO runs short on funds some year, wouldn't it be okay to let the government subsidize A.A. groups in hospitals and prisons?
- **4.** Is it more important to get a big A.A. collection from a few people, or a smaller collection in which more members participate?
- **5.** Is a group treasurer's report unimportant A.A. business? How does the treasurer feel about it?
- **6.** How important in my recovery is the feeling of self respect, rather than the feeling of being always under obligation for charity received?

Whenever I find myself under acute tensions, I lengthen my daily walks and slowly repeat our Serenity Prayer in rhythm to my steps and breathing.

This benign healing process of repetition, sometimes necessary to persist with for days, has seldom failed to restore me to at least a workable emotional balance and perspective.
